The growth in our junior and women's registrations over the last two seasons has been remarkable considering the competition we face from other sports. These three reasons are why we are the fastest growing hockey club in Sydney & I expect to report next year that we will become the number one club.

Our four women's team all had an outstanding year after joining a new alliance in the Sydney North Women's competition. The standard of the competition was excellent and games were played in a friendly but competitive spirit. This had been missing in previous years. Our 2nd grade side were worthy semi finalists and could easily have brought home the winners trophy. Our 1st grade team had an outstanding year having only lost 1 match. They were worthy premiers triumphing 1-0 in their grand final. Our ND3 and ND4 teams were extremely unlucky by only narrowly missing semi final berths. I would like to extend my thanks to Belinda Fitton and the women's committee for their tireless work in making this new competition run so smoothly.

After a successful registration day, we ended up with 9 junior teams and a very busy season ahead of us. What is very pleasing was that we had 3 teams in each of the U11 and U13 age groups. This bodes well for the future. The standard of play in the juniors has improved markedly over 2007 and I would like to take this opportunity to thank all coaches and managers for hard work over the year. That hard work really did pay off. We ended up having 6 teams make the semi finals with 2 teams being runners up. This was an outstanding level of success for the club. More importantly, our players continue to enjoy the games speed, skill and friendships that our club brings. I would also like to offer my congratulations to those players who made representative teams this season.

If the on field activity wasn't hectic enough, the work going on behind the scenes was non stop. The District Dribble newsletters were simply fantastic and will prove to be a great piece of the clubs history. My thanks to Fiona Begg and all those who contributed articles. Eileen Tudor was busily running H2H hockey and upgrading our superb website whilst coaching our U11A team. These efforts made Eileen a worthy winner of our club person of the year.

With all this going on, Chris Jenkins and his 80th anniversary committee were putting the finishing touches on what will go down as a memorable evening in the clubs history. With the hall at the Pennant Hills Bowling Club fully decked out in club colours and some fantastic memorabilia, we were set for a great celebration. We had over 100 guests from life members, past men's champions, women's and junior parents come together to remember past glories and plan for future successes. We had a great slideshow with teams from 1927 onwards, hockey sticks that still baffle me, various shirt designs through the years that kept us all entertained. The framed blazer, donated by Alex Scott, of our 1946 Men's premiership winning team was an invaluable item of the club's history. It will be the centrepiece in a future clubhouse. But the memories were not just hanging on wall, or sitting on tables. Watching past players relive stories from the past with their fellow players and friends was great to see. What was even more impressive was that many of the club's past legends made the effort to attend the junior presentation day on the Saturday and then topped their weekend off by watching the 1st grade women triumph on the Sunday. This level of camaraderie was inspiring to me as club president and I extend my thanks to all those people who made the weekend so enjoyable.

So with 2007 being such a successful year, we all enter the 2008 season with renewed enthusiasm. I feel very proud to represent a club that has outstanding supporters behind its current and future success. I look forward to seeing you around the fields in 2008.

Treasurers Report

Our financials are divided into two sections being the Club (consisting of Junior's, Women's & Veterans teams) and the Sports Foundation (managing the synthetic surface). Details of the two groups are as follows:

CLUB

The Committee decided to maintain our playing fees the same for the third year in a row. This also included the fundraising levy of \$30 per family, which continues to be a success (compared to selling chocolates).

With 8 junior (plus the under 9's), 4 women's & 1 veteran teams, this year our Association has recorded a surplus of \$6,286 compared to \$5,447 in 2006. This profit has been mainly achieved from the summer competition program run in October to December 2006.

As we are a Non profit organisation run by volunteers, for the Club to continue to grow it is paramount that all players and their parents help out wherever possible.

SPORTS FOUNDATION

This is our fifth year, which operates the hiring of the synthetic surface and the running of the canteen. The income stream is derived from the field from the following sources:

Hire of the Field

This is broken up into winter & summer competitions, training and schools. The main users of the facility for the relative competitions throughout the year have been the following:

Sydney Hockey Association	(Men's competition)
Sydney North Women's Association	(Women's competition)
North Shore Women's Association	(Women's competition)
North Area Junior Hockey Association	(junior competition)

Our thanks go to these Associations and their affiliated clubs for their patronage, which is greatly appreciated, and look forward to this continuing into years to come.

The income derived from the hire of the field has increased from \$84,163 to \$99,349 and this is due to us being able to utilise the field fully throughout the weekend. Last year the hire of the field on Sundays was hampered however this was resolved and is now fully in use. A break up between the different sections reveals the following variances

Winter Competition (Junior & Senior games)	up 34%
Training	up 9%
Schools	down 11%

It is evident that the field is being used to its full capacity however during the summer months this is not the case. Except for our summer competition, the field is rarely used. Going forward this is being addressed and advise that in late October, we had two gridiron games. This is expected to continue next year with the possibility of further games.

My thanks go to all volunteers who put up their hands to assist in the opening and closing of the field throughout the year. A special thanks must go to Carolyn Linke for her "last minute calls" to open the field throughout the week for various school games & trainings as well as on weekends for the seniors.

Canteen

As the turf facility is used by numerous Associations over the weekends ranging from juniors on Friday nights and Saturday mornings, the men's competition on Saturday afternoon & night and the women's competition all day Sunday, it is always going to be difficult in organising a roster to cover all these times.

The gross sales from the canteen have increased by 16% to \$28,528 with the overall net income being \$11,159 compared to \$10,861. Whilst the bottom line has only increased by 3%, it should be noted that we hold stock of around \$1,200 (drinks, sweets etc) that has been paid for in full and is covered under purchases. For consistency, we do not hold a stock figure for the canteen. If this was, then it would increase the NP by the amount of stock held.

As indicated in previous annual reports, due to the amount being derived through the canteen, it is not feasible to "employ" someone to run this therefore it will continue to be manned by volunteers. This includes each team manning the canteen & BBQ whilst their children are playing.

My thanks go to Fiona Deane & Anne Maher for their assistance in purchasing stock. Further work needs to be undertaken for Sunday's & this will be looked at over the next few months.

In the fifth year of operation, the Sports Foundation has achieved a net profit of \$27,657 after allowing for depreciation of fixed assets of \$46,107.

GENERAL

Overall a further pleasing year from an Association prospective and with the continued help from the handful of volunteers plus the possibility of further assistance in the future from other volunteers will only ensure that this great Association continues to grow into the future

On a personal note, I would like to thank my wife Tracey for her patience and assistance over the past year.

I submit the financial reports of the Association for your approval at the Annual General Meeting in November 2007.

1. SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

The accounts have been prepared on the following basis, which are consistent with those of the previous year.

- a) Subscriptions (fees) and completed functions are accounted for in the period to which they relate and all other income and expenditure is accounted for on a cash basis.
- b) Northern District Hockey Association Incorporated is exempt from income tax under Section 50-45 of the Income Tax Assessment Act.
- c) Non current assets, at cost or valuation are depreciated at rates based upon their expected economic lives, using the straight-line method so as to write off the net cost of each asset during its expected useful life.
- d) All inventories are valued at the lower of cost or net realisable value.

2. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS

- a) The Association is required under the Associations Incorporation's Act 1984 to furnish statements at the Annual General Meeting, which give a true and fair view of:
 - 1) Income and Expenditure of the Association during the year and;
 - 2) Assets and Liabilities of the Association at the end of the Financial year.
- b) The Committee are of the opinion that Northern District Hockey Association Incorporated is not a reporting entity and have decided that the current format of the accounts and the accounting policies, which are consistent with past years, are appropriate for the Members, given the nature of the Association's activities. A special purpose financial report has therefore been prepared and audited under the Constitution of the Association

The 2007 Northern District Metro Team consisted of only three players who had played in the same division the previous year. Three players had been promoted from 2006's U15 White and six players had come up from the U13s. This year, three players also competed in representative teams: Sam in Sydney U15/3 and Madi and Annalese in North Shore U15/2. A number of the younger players had chosen to take the year off from representative duties. The experience of the team varied from two years to multi years playing hockey.

The SJHA Sydney Wide U15 competition was in only its second year and provided the players with the opportunity to play against many representative players of both regional and state level. Teams in the draw were: Sutherland, Glebe, Ryde, Moorebank, Bankstown, Sydney Uni, St George, Baulkham Hills and Gordon/North Sydney. There were 18 rounds of normal competition.

Although it is a mixed competition, there were a number of teams which did not field female players. Whilst these teams dominated in size and strength this did not necessarily compensate for their lack of skill – although they were quite intimidating. The draw was dominated by four very strong teams.

The Northern District Metro team was constantly challenged and although they had a disproportionate for and against statistic recorded against them, the team maintained a good attitude going into all their games and a determination throughout.

The final season result was not a true indication of the fabulous goal-keeping of Andrew, who stopped shots fired at him from all angles and was constantly placed under pressure. He had good defensive support from Brendan, Zoe, and Aaron, who in turn were greatly assisted by Sam and Ben, both of whom could be counted on to be wherever the action happened to be. Shannon and Antoni worked in wings and inner positions along with Simone and Annalese. James, Madi and Bradley ably worked the forward and half positions. The team's main obstacle tended to be distributing the ball to available players rather than trying to take the most direct route to the goal—unfortunately that's when we were outnumbered and overpowered!

The team was also ably supported by a number of other Northern District players including; Mathew (U13 Gold) and Josh, Joel, Amanda, Ruan and John (U15 Blue) – we were grateful for their effort to make themselves available to play.

The draw was structured in such a way that scheduled representative games (eg U15 North State) did not interfere with the running of the SJHA Sydney wide competition. We were fortunate to have almost the entire second half of the draw as home games.

During the season, Thursday night training in 2007 was effected by very inclement weather and power issues, resulting in a lack of continuity to training.
